NASR

- Formed as the Federation of Australian Speedway (FAS) in 1987 and incorporated as NASR in 1998
- Delegated to co-ordinate and administratively control all facets of speedway racing in Australia.
- Current permanent memberships number approximately 7000 nationally, with up to 6000 additional Personal Accident Insurance associated memberships
- Majority of competitors race on an amateur basis.
